How to be really helpful

The times of particular need are the **first Saturday**, to load the bar counters at St. Albans, the **Monday morning** to build the stillage (scaffolding for the beer) and put up the beer, and the **second Saturday** for takedown and to reload what was previously unloaded. It's hard work and the more people the better but, if you help with the set-up and take-down, please make sure that you come **suitably dressed** and **wearing good strong boots** or **working shoes**. Scaffolding poles and trainers do not mix. Also, if you have some **safety gloves** please bring them with you.

On the three festival days we especially need people on the **Thursday and Friday evenings** behind the bar but we need staff **every day from 9am** to get the hall ready for opening and to stay **beyond 'time'** to help clear the hall. If you are new to bar work, advice and training will be given by qualified bar managers.

Staff Benefits

- Staff who arrive by 10am on set-up days may claim a lunch allowance of £2.50.
- For each half day of an 'open' session there will be an allowance of 2.5 free pints of cask beer or cider.
- For each half day of an 'open' session there will be a 50% discount on meal prices.
- There are staff glasses available at the glasses stall for use at the Festival. If you wish to take away a
 Festival glass please ask the Glasses Manager as there is a discount for staff.
- Festival T-shirts will be provided (one per person).
- There will be a party for all who have helped with take-down on the Saturday evening.
- There will be a subsidised pub social for all festival volunteers later in the year.

Best Practice behind the Bar

- Ensure that you wash your hands after using the toilet, taking snuff or smoking if you are working with beer, glasses or food.
- Try not to stand with your back to the paying public; we need to sell the beer, not to tick our own beer list!
- Please do not stand and chat to friends the other side of the bar, however tempting that may seem. If you want to, consult the bar manager and take a break to join them.
- If arriving early evening, try to work behind the bar for an hour or so before eating as those already on the bar are likely to have been there all afternoon.
- When time is called, put your beer aside and please do not drink in front of the public. It can cause problems with clearing the hall which will delay opening the staff bar!
